

THE LOCAL'S GUIDE TO QUEENSTOWN

Whether you have a few days to spend in Queenstown before or after your New Zealand Trails adventure or you are spending your free day here on our World Heritage Walking Tour, we want to save you some time and have some suggestions on how you should fill your day(s). We've compiled a guide of all our favourite bars, cafés, trails and things to do in the area. As Queenstown locals, these are the places we can be found indulging, tramping (the Kiwi word for hiking) and sipping on our favourite coffees! With the help of this handy guide, we hope that you will have the most incredible day exploring our home town.

Breakfast, Brunch and Lunch



Bespoke Kitchen 9 Isle Street, Queenstown 9300

This trendy café just off Queenstown's main street is a firm favourite of our New Zealand Trails team. Their carefully crafted menu focuses on using the best local and organic produce. Bespoke work hard to adhere to all dietary requirements, and you'll notice immediately the array of vegan friendly dishes on their menu. They place a special emphasis on health and sustainability, but where they really excel is in their presentation - the food looks amazing! If you are here for breakfast/brunch, you can't go wrong with their delicious housemade granola made with oats, stewed apple and blackberry, rose water buckwheat cluster, vanilla yoghurt and seasonal fruit, their creamy vegan mushrooms on sourdough or their rather lavish breakfast board. Yonder 14 Church Street

They claim to make the best coffee in Queenstown (the most coveted title in Queenstown!) and it's difficult to disagree! What is for certain is that they make their baked goods from scratch and have a great craft beer and cocktails collection. It's a great spot to check out if you are feeling a little parched! Yonder also caters for all dietary requirements without compromising on taste or creativity. They were even voted in the 'top 10 brunch spots in Queenstown' by Culture Trip. Vudu Café & Larder 16 Rees Street

Another frequent haunts of ours is Vudu Café and Larder. Vudu is run by the same group as Bespoke, so expect the same high standards but even more focused on pure indulgence. They are the perfect place to go when the sun is shining. Perch yourself outside and soak up the gorgeous lake views while indulging in one of their many delicious dishes. If you are going there for lunch, we recommend the slow roasted pork belly burger with handcut agria fries. If it's busy don't worry, join the line and your waiter will quickly come up and ask you if you are after a table. Dietaries are not a problem here, they have heaps of yummy treats that suit everyone. We also love getting a takeaway coffee, delicious treat and sipping it down by the lake front. Dinner



The Grille by Eichardt's 9 Marine Parade

One of Queenstown's premier dining destinations, The Grille by Eichardt's sits right on the waterfront. The charming interior may pay homage to New York City bistros, but their menu is all about New Zealand, showcasing the unique tastes of Central Otago and Southland. For something totally different, there's Blue Kanu, a restaurant that blends two cultures and two styles, Pacifica and Asian to create "Polynasia". You can't help but notice the line down the street outside of this famous burger joint. Their burgers are worth the hype! Bars



Smiths Craft Beer House 53 Shotover Street

Your quintessential craft beer house. With a beer menu that fills an entire wall, you won't run out of flavours to sample. Smiths' food menu also does not disappoint, featuring all the favourites like burgers, pizza and fries in big portions! They've perfected the pub classics and executed them with a creative twist. Little Mez Cow Lane

This cozy cocktail bar is Queenstown's hidden gem. Tucked away on Cow Lane, Little Mez is dedicated to great cocktails and all things Tequila and Mezcal. Another of our team's favourites is Little Blackwood. Sitting in the famous Steamer Wharf Waterfront, this beautiful cocktail bar and eatery has it all. Trails



Queenstown Hill Distance: 4.2km (2.6 miles)

This easily accessible hike from the centre of Queenstown is a firm favourite among locals and tourists alike. Climbing its way for 500 metres up through pine forest to the summit of Te Tapu-nui (mountain of intense sacredness), you will emerge out of the tree line onto the hillside. There, you will take in views of the whole of Queenstown including the Remarkables, Lake Wakatipu and Cecil Peak. Check out the 'Basket of Dreams' sculpture, which asks you to "look inward to reflect to draw inspiration from the mountains, lake and from those who are with you and outward to dream for the future." Then push on a little further to reach the summit. Find out more about the Queenstown Hill track here



Queenstown Gardens Trail Distance: 3.1km (1.9 miles)

Stroll through Queenstown's botanical gardens, enjoying flowers, mature trees and a relaxing atmosphere. This tranquil sanctuary is located just a few minutes walk from central Queenstown and a lovely place to stretch your legs. Explore the gardens and then follow the trail along the lake to take in views of Cecil and Walker Peak, and the Kelvin Peninsula. Click <u>here</u> to find out more about the Queenstown Gardens.



Sawpit Gully Distance: 7.3km (4.5 miles) (loop track)

If you want to earn your views, catch a bus or taxi out to Arrowtown for the day and hike Sawpit Gully. You'll experience all the New Zealand native vegetation as beech forest turns to tussock, matagouri, and speargrass. If you're doing this hike in Autumn, enjoy the autumn colours as the exotic larch leaves turn to gold. You'll hike to the saddle between German Hill and craggy Brow Peak. The views out over Lake Hayes on the descent are particularly breath-taking. Read on <u>here</u> for more information about Sawpit Gully.



Tiki Trail Distance: 1.6km (1 mile)

If you don't want to pay for the gondola to get that iconic view of Queenstown, you can walk up the hill! The hourlong walk takes you through Douglas fir and beech forest, emerging out on top to views galore. From there, grab a coffee in the skyline restaurant, go paragliding, luging, bungee jumping or enjoy the view. Find out more about the Tiki Trail <u>here</u>.



Ben Lomond

Distance: 14km (8.7 miles) (return trip)

If you are up for a rewarding and challenging full-day hike, Ben Lomond is a local favourite. The trail is accessible from the town centre and has stunning panoramic views. Start from the bottom of the Tiki Trail or take the Skyline Gondola to the top of Bob's Peak to save a bit of time and make your way from there. Whether you choose to turn around at the saddle or push on to reach the summit, the impressive views are the real appeal of this iconic track and will not disappoint. On a clear day, you'll look out over Queenstown, Lake Wakatipu, The Remarkables, and Cecil and Walter Peaks. Find out more information about hiking Ben Lomond <u>here.</u>

Day Activities



Wine Tours

If you consider yourself a wine connoisseur, then you will have no doubt heard of Gibbston Valley and its delicious pinot noir. We are lucky enough to live in New Zealand's most scenic wine region and these world-renowned vineyards are located just outside of Queenstown and are well worth a visit. The easiest way to do so is by joining a wine tour. We recommend the Sampler Tour from <u>Altitude Tours</u> or their Twilight Wine and Craft Beer Tour if you are keen to sample both local wines and brews. Another great option is <u>Hop On, Hop</u> <u>Off Wine Tours</u>. The Hop on, Hop Off tour leaves from central Queenstown and stops at 17 different wineries and breweries. We recommend hopping off to further explore Akarua, Kinross Cellar Door & Bistro and Gibbston Valley Winery.



Explore Arrowtown

This historic gold mining town is absolutely charming and is well worth a visit. You can get there by taxi or bus (blue #2 route Arthurs Point to Arrowtown). There's something to suit everyone in Arrowtown! You could walk the Arrowtown Trail or Sawpit Gully, explore the old Chinese village or wine and dine to your heart's content. As for food and drinks, we love Provisions, The Dishery, and Slow Cuts for a bite to eat, followed up with a glass of wine or a craft beer in the sun at The Fork & Tap. Kiwi Birdlife Park

If you want to learn more about our native wildlife, then take a trip to the Kiwi Birdlife Park. There, you can explore the 5 acres of native bush and see Kiwi, Kea, Tuatara, and Geckos. Historic Cruise on the TSS Earnslaw

Take a cruise on New Zealand's most iconic vessel, the century-old coal fired steamship, TSS Earnslaw, affectionately known as Ernie by locals. You'll get one of the best views of Queenstown on this 90-minute cruise across Lake Wakatipu. Make sure to take a peek into the engine room to see the giant steam engines at work. Skyline Gondola

Enjoy a scenic ride on Queenstown's iconic gondola. Take in the stunning views of Queenstown, Coronet Peak, The Remarkables, and Walter and Cecil Peak as you are carried 450 metres (1,476 ft) above Queenstown to the top of Bob's Peak. Once you arrive at the top, relax and take in the scenery, take a few rides on the Luge, or enjoy a drink or meal at the Stratosfare Restaurant and Bar. Bike the Local Trails
